
### JANUARY MEETING - LET'S EXPLORE REDWORK!

Redwork is a form of surface embroidery that was usually done on useful items for the home, such as towels, aprons, tablecovers, etc.

It is a fun and relaxing stitching experience! You just follow the simple lines, like coloring, with a stem stitch or back stitch, then do some improvising to fill in where you want. You can make it as simple or ornate as you like! And there's only one color, so no constant switching or checking charts.

Since so many inspirations for redwork come from simple line art-like coloring books, I decided to try it with the stitching tool art that EGA has on its website! I love the simple pretty lines of the tools.

I will be emailing the whole file to everyone in January, and you will pick two, print them, bring them to the meeting, and transfer them to your fabric, and we can have fun embroidering them! When finished, we will make them up into simple zippered pouches to hold your stitching tools.



Look at all the fun designs to choose from!

Here is my finished pouch; I chose the pincushion and the scissors.





The linen fabric was donated by Gerty Romer and will be free! But please email me at **(scrubbed)** to let me know if you are coming and would like a piece, so I can prepare enough.

#### You will need to bring:

- A skein of DMC in red; any red you like. I used 321, but any nice red will do. OR, you can go rogue and make it Bluework! Or Greenwork! Your choice.
- An embroidery hoop, 8" is best.
- A pencil for transfer. I recommend a red pencil if you are going to stitch in red, but a plain black one will do also.
- An embroidery needle, for using two strands of cotton floss.
- Usual stitching supplies.



This lovely series of trees by Mary Corbet are all in one E-Book! We are going to do them as a group!

Then you can print the directions and come join us at our March meeting. When you decide which tree/trees you want to try, you can pull threads from your stash according to what is needed in the instructions. Great stash buster project! You can decide to change up the colors so that they are not "Christmassy" at all, but perhaps some spring colors? Fall? Your choice.

You decide if you want to do them as a set of two fingertip towels as shown, or if you want to do them on your own fabric. You can make them into ornaments, or framed pieces, or on a pillow; the possibilities are endless!

If you want to do the towels, we will have them available in sets of two, ready to finish with the red stripes at the hems.

In April, we will have a session where we will learn to do the fancy drawn thread hemstitching shown here. You can do this on your tree towel, or just come and learn how to do it on some linen of your own.
